David E. Bane, Sr., age 81, passed away surrounded by his loving family Saturday, April 18, 2020, at North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, Mississippi. Private graveside services and interment will be Monday, April 20 at Memorial Cemetery in Louisville, Mississippi, with Rev. Tim Horton officiating. In order for the family to follow the COVID-19 precautions in place under Executive Order 1466 of Governor Tate Reeves, the service will be private.

David was born October 30, 1938, to Earnest Roy and Carrie Mills Bane in the Ford Community of Winston County, Mississippi. He was a member of First Baptist Church of Louisville. David retired from his career with Southern Natural Gas Company. He enjoyed fishing and hunting until his health prevented his participation in these activities.
