Floyce Dean Adcock Shumaker, 87, passed away on Thursday, April 3, 2025, at Oktibbeha County Hospital in Starkville, Mississippi. Funeral services will be 3 p.m. Tuesday, April 8 at New Hope Baptist Church in Attala County with Reverends Terrell Mayo and Adelbert Adcock officiating. 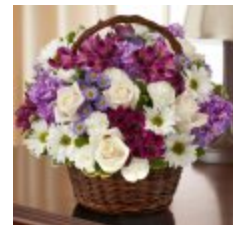
