November 19, 1929 - October 2, 2017

Mr. Travis L. Whitten, 87, passed away surrounded by his loving family on Monday, October 2, 2017, at Winston Medical Center in Louisville, Mississippi. Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. on Wednesday, October 4, 2017, in the Nowell Massey Funeral Home Chapel with Rev. Trent Jaudon officiating. Visitation will be the day of the service at Nowell Massey Funeral Home from 12:30 p.m. until service time. Interment will follow in Memorial Park Cemetery.
